

John Anthony Joseph Bradley, 47, Zimmerman, MN, died Friday, September 3rd at his home near Zimmerman.

John was born at Laurium, Michigan on November 21, 1962, son of John Joseph and Patricia Marie (Witkowski) Bradley. Growing up John's dad served with the US Air Force, so the family moved frequently.
