

On July 15, 2012, **Marijane Daniels** was reunited with her long-time friend and companion, Donald Nelson, who preceded her in death in December 1999. Marijane was born at home on October 5, 1919, the daughter of Fred and Alma Daniels, who preceded her in death in April 1957 and August 1968 respectively. She is survived by her brother and sister-in-law, William and June Daniels of Manistee; one niece, Elaine (Steven) Gonzales of Redford and children Carley, Stephanie, Nicolas and Anita; three nephews, Charles (Barbara) Daniels of Traverse City and their children, Charles Daniels and Danielle Gaudard and their children Charles, Christina, Lindsey and Jake, Donald Daniels of Grand Rapids and Robert (Patricia) Daniels of Rockford.

In addition to her parents, Marijane was also preceded in death by a sister Agnes in February 1915 and by a brother Charles in July 1993.

Marijane was the granddaughter of Anna and Charles H. Daniels. Charles was the founder of the C.H. Daniels Brewery of Manistee. She was also the great niece of Louis Doelle, the first non-Native American born in "the encampment by the river" that became the City of Manistee.

Marijane lived her entire life in the red brick house at 59 Smith Street in Manistee. She was a 1937 graduate of Manistee High School and co-valedictorian of her graduating class. Marijane and Don were life-long supporters of the school's athletic teams, especially the girls' basketball team. She and Don were named "Manistee High School Fans of the Year" for the 1986-87 school year.

Marijane worked at the Manistee County Savings Bank/Manistee Bank and Trust Company from one week after her high school graduation in June 1937 until her retirement as Assistant Vice-President in 1982. She was a life-long communicant of Guardian Angels Catholic Church of Manistee, where her mother Alma, grandmother, Melina Doelle Wilcke and great grandmother, Elizabeth Doelle were founding members. For many years Marijane was the treasurer of the Carrie Filer Fund and was also a supporter of the Manistee County Historical Museum.

The funeral mass from the Order of Christian Burials will be celebrated Thursday, July 19th at 11:00 a.m. at Guardian Angels Catholic Church with Rev. Sylvestre Obwaka as celebrant. Burial will be in the Oak Grove Cemetery. The evening prayers will be prayed at the Johnson Funeral Home Wednesday evening at 8:00 p.m. The family will receive friends at the funeral home on Wednesday from 2 until 4 and from 7 until 9 p.m.

The family has requested that memorial contributions be made to the Nelson Guardian Angels Church Fund or the Nelson Manistee County Humane Society Fund, via the Manistee County Community Foundation or the Carrie Filer Fund.
