



Dolores Tabaczka, loving wife, mother, grandmother, great grandmother and friend, age 86, of Manistee, was welcomed by her heavenly Father, March 24, while surrounded by the love of her family.

She was born April 8, 1923 in Manistee to the late Joseph and Mary (Siuda) Switalski. She married Harry S. (Jerry) Tabaczka on April 2, 1945 at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Manistee.

Dolores graduated from Manistee High School, Class of 1940. Ever open to learning more about life and all that it offered she attended West Shore Community College. She worked for Koehler Brothers in Saginaw and retired from the Manistee County Department of Social Services as Office Manager in 1980. She was a member of the Catholic Daughters of America #496, the St. Joseph Parish Rosary Society and the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary #4499. She was a communicant of St. Joseph Catholic Church of Manistee. Dolores was a lifelong family historian, documenting the personal side of what is important in life, and a published poet.

She was a county girl at heart and loved all of God's beautiful creations. She was often recognized as the Flower Lady for her tireless work with the Blossoms on the Boulevard that graced U.S. 31. She created numerous books of poetry shared with her family over the years and authored a family children's book.
