PROTOCOLS FOR ATTENDING MASS IN CHURCH

Church limited to 100 people (25% of church capacity). *Please consider attending a weekday Mass when the church isn't as full to fulfil your Sunday obligation, as permitted during this time by Bishop Raica.*

Social Distancing Continues - 6 feet apart in church & when leaving.

It is recommended that you take your temperature before you leave for church. If you, or anyone in your household is running a temp of 100.4 or higher, or has recently been ill, please stay home.

The use of masks is expected in our parishes, so long as you are medically able to do so. (Not to be used with children 2 & younger).

Please bring hand sanitizer - Use before & after you receive Eucharist.

If you have your own missal, you may use it in church - please be sure to take it home with you. All missals & hymnals have been removed from the pews.

Dress appropriately - Windows & doors will be open for ventilation.

You may wear gloves if you wish, but they must be removed to receive Eucharist.

The Holy Water fonts will remain empty.

Every other pew is to remain empty. You should sit 6 feet apart from non-household members. Family members in the same household may sit together.

Robust singing by the congregation should be minimal, if at all.

There will be no Procession of Gifts. There will be a basket in the back of church for your donation if you do not donate online.

Do not shake hands at the Sign of Peace.

Ushers will direct the faithful to the receiving line to ensure spacing. Communion will only be in the form of the Precious Body at this time.

We strongly encourage everyone to receive communion on their hand. If you feel you must receive on your tongue, please position yourself so that you are at the end of the communion line.

These are the protocols that the Diocese has placed for now. They are subject to change as we see how the slow open begins.
