

Thomas F. Adamczak, age 80 of Manistee, Michigan, died Sunday, July 3, 2022 at the American House ASP in Holland, Michigan.

He was born on August 2, 1941 in Manistee, Michigan son of the late Harry and Phyllis (Kadzban) Adamczak. He was a graduate of Saint Joseph High School with the class of 1959. Tom served in the United States Navy during the Vietnam War from May 29 1961 until May 28, 1965. He married Kay F. Wertenberger on October 19, 1963 at Saint Joseph Catholic Church in Manistee.
