

LaVerne David Bachinski, age 92 from Manistee, passed away in his sleep March 18, 2023 at The Grand assisted living facility in Dublin, Ohio to be in the loving arms of God, and to join his beloved wife Dorothy, in heaven.

LaVerne was born January 2, 1931 in Manistee, the son of the late Joseph and Beatrice (Lass) Bachinski. His brother Joseph also preceded him in death, a casualty of World War II in Moerdijk, Holland.

He was a graduate of Manistee High School class of 1948. He had been class President both Sophomore and Senior years. He enjoyed every opportunity that he had to meet with his classmates for their reunions. LaVerne continued his formal education at Michigan State University earning a Bachelor of Science degree in residential building in 1954.

LaVerne held executive positions in the building and real estate development industry for over 50 years before retiring to care for his wife. Starting with homes he built in Manistee, he went on to oversee the building of thousands of both single and multi-family homes in Kansas and throughout Ohio.

LaVerne married Dorothy Knudstrup at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Manistee on July 5, 1952. She preceded him in death on November 16, 2008, after 56 years of marriage. He was a wonderful husband and father with a great sense of mischievous humor. His family knew he would do anything for them. LaVerne was a member of St Joseph Catholic Church of Manistee, where he had also served as an usher and was a member of the Knights of Columbus. He is a life member (71 years) of B.P.O. Elks Lodge #250 and had belonged to several civic groups including the Kiwanis and past president of the Manistee Jaycees. He was involved in the Boy Scouts with his sons and had a love for exploring the outdoors, especially fascinated with all types of trees. He greatly enjoyed anything with family, including hiking, hunting, jeeping and camping. He was a drummer in a local dance band in the 40s and early 50s, playing throughout Manistee County. However, marriage and a baby girl changed that.
