

James P. Toczynski, age 74, of Manistee, MI, died Friday, Dec. 22, 2023 at his home in Filer Township. He was born March 25, 1949 in Manistee, son of the late Floyd A. and Genevieve T. (Duby) Toczynski.

He attended St. Joseph School and graduated valedictorian from Manistee Catholic Central with the class of 1967. He attended Michigan State University as a merit scholar, receiving his bachelor's degree in 1971. He was employed as a computer programmer with the Michigan State Police in East Lansing, where Jim resided from 1975 until his retirement in 2003. Shortly after his

retirement from the MSP, he returned to Manistee to help care for his parents.

Jim was a lifelong musician. His interest and love of music began early on, which included accordion lessons and participation in grade school and high school band and eventually becoming a member of Band X. He was a proud member of Call to Action, DignityUSA, PFLAG Manistee and Manistee 100 Men Who Care. He was a member of Divine Mercy Parish of Manistee. He was supportive of the Manistee County Library and also the Vogue Theatre to help preserve their histories. He enjoyed reading, watching Jeopardy and attending Trivia Night at area establishments with his brother & sister-in-law. His vast and obscure trivia knowledge was often feared but revered.

Jim was appreciative of nature's beauty. He enjoyed paddling the lakes and rivers of Northern Michigan and shared one of his last river paddling adventures together with his sister near her home in Florida this past spring. He was thankful for hiking trails, camping, kayaking and canoeing as well as Yoga classes. Most of all, Jim expressed his thankfulness for the incredibly loving family and friends he was blessed to have.

He is survived by his partner, Dennis Dunlap of East Lansing, MI; his sister & brother-in-law, Barbara & Henry Perri of New Port Richie, FL and his brother & sister-in-law, Philip & Traci Toczynski of Manistee, MI. Numerous nieces, nephews, great-nieces, nephews and cousins also survive him.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his sister, Marianne Kubacki.
