After her retirement from the flower business, she continued her community involvement with the Garden Club, West Shore Hospital Auxiliary, The Elks, Divine Mercy Rosary Society and Right to Life of Manistee County. She was an avid golfer enjoying her involvement with the Manistee Golf and Country Club and currently serving on the board. She always looked forward to the Monday and Wednesday golf leagues.

For the last several years she was blessed with the companionship of Carl Loftis. She was blessed with the gift of meeting new friends in Parker Arizona where they wintered for the past several years. Mary Lou enjoyed the girls trips with her friends in Parker, always being adventurous to a new casino. She and Carl enjoyed traveling to the Upper Peninsula where they met with friends in the summer for golf and fun. Carl's children and five grandchildren, were very special to Mary Lou's heart, always enjoying their family gatherings, holidays and trips to Spring Lake.

Most dear to Mary Lou's heart was Manistee Catholic Central, she was involved with the alumni association, she served as a co-chair for many years of the Harvest Fall Fund Raiser and currently served on the board of the Manistee Catholic Central Foundation.
