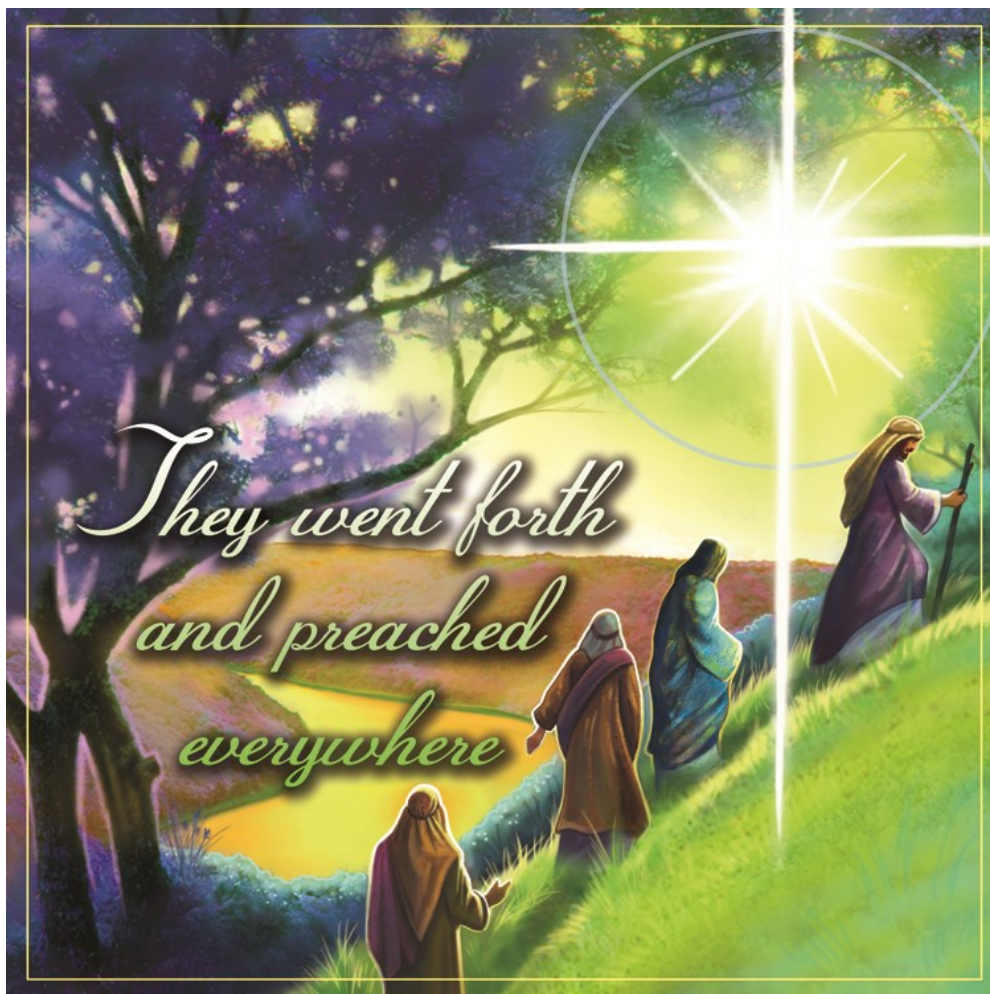

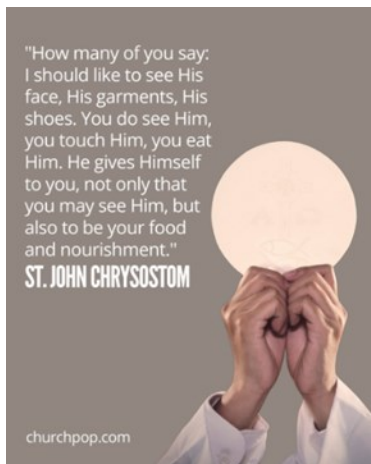

## A Look at the Week Ahead from Fr. Roman

This weekend is a big day for our Divine Mercy Parish! It is the day that some of our young children will experience the joy of receiving their First Communion, as well as the Sacrament of Confirmation. The sacraments, that is what our faith is all about. Why? Because it is in the sacraments that we experience the divine life of the Most Holy Trinity!

We are excited to have Bishop Walsh here with us the Sunday at the 8:00am Morning Mass to preside and celebrate these sacraments. The role of the bishop is so important, so whenever we have the opportunity to host him we should be very grateful. There is only one of him and over 60 parishes in the Diocese of Gaylord! He has to visit many of them each year during this Easter Season as he celebrates the Sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation with the youth across Northern Michigan.



Here are three things we can ponder this week with gratitude: the Eucharist, Confirmation and Christ's presence in the office of the Bishop.

First, the Most Holy Eucharist. We believe as Catholics that Jesus comes to dwell with us each Mass in His body, blood, soul and divinity. The bread and wine are not symbolic, they are transformed, or rather, transubstantiated. Once the priest or bishop says the words of consecration, Jesus Himself becomes fully present and it can never turn back into bread and wine. This is why we store the remaining consecrated hosts in the tabernacle. The Eucharist gives each one of us the divine life, the divine love of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. All that it requires of us is true faith. Do we have the same excitement for the Eucharist as these children will show us at their First Communion?

Second, the Sacrament of Confirmation. The main Person of the Trinity in Confirmation is the Holy Spirit. Who is the Holy Spirit? The love of the Father and the Son poured out to us! When we say God is love, it is the Father, Son and Holy Spirit that we are imitating. Divine love is all-giving, sacrificial, perfect. (see 1 Corinthians 13:1-13 for a little recap) Confirmation is what gives us the strength to keep the fire in our hearts burning to live a Christian life. The Holy Spirit is powerful and can transform our hearts if we allow it. Do we remember the 7 gifts and 12 fruits of the Holy Spirit? Our young ones learned them for the sacrament this weekend. This is a good reminder to study them again and put them to action in our lives! See Isaiah 11:1-2 and 1 Corinthians 12:1-31.



Third, Christ's presence in the office of the Bishop. Jesus himself appointed the 12 apostles as the first bishops. They were given the power to teach, sanctify and govern with the power of the Holy Spirit. Each bishop has very special gifts from God to make his Church holy! Let us pray for Bishop Walsh's ministry and for all bishops who have such great responsibilities, but also great spiritual power to lead the Church into all truth, light and joy in a difficult world.

## Ascension of the Lord

Today's readings center around one glorious event, the ascension of Jesus into heaven. This moment shows us the divine authority of God through the fulfillment of his mission here on earth. Let us lift up our hearts, praising Jesus for all he accomplished through his ascension.

As followers of Christ, we are all called to trust in God's timing. Just as the disciples obeyed His words to preach the Gospel and await "the promise of the Father," we too must put all our trust into the Lord.


Reflect on a time when you waited for something important - how does the apostles' experience waiting in Jerusalem for the Holy Spirit help you understand the role of patience in your life?

### Matthew 25:35 Food Pantry

We would like to thank our faithful and generous food pantry volunteers, as well as the many contributors from our parish and community, who have generously given of their time, talents, and treasures for the distribution of groceries to those in need of food assistance in Manistee County at the food pantry.

We would like to acknowledge and thank the following: St. Bernard’s Catholic Church & St. Bernard’s Rosary Society in Irons for their continuing support with groceries and financial donations, The Sunset Shoreline Strutters (local chapter of the National Wildlife Turkey Federation), the friends and family of Don Zwiefka Jr., and an anonymous donor who generously donated to our mission. Also, our sincere appreciation to all the kind and generous donors who drop off groceries and provide support on a regular basis.

The pantry has registered 176 families (371 household members) this year. Of the 176 families registered, we serve an average of 110 each month.

The need for assistance with groceries is great and never-ending. According to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics, several of the basic foods we consume everyday have increased, as much as 96%, in the past four years.

## Mt. Carmel Cemetery Rules & Regulations

Mt. Carmel Cemetery, located at the corner of Maple and Merkey Roads in Manistee, is hallowed ground and shares with all sacred places regulations to insure reverence, neatness, safety and order. Cemetery visiting hours are 8 AM to 8 PM.

To promote the natural beauty of our cemetery, the safety of our visitors and caretakers, to facilitate cleanup and out of respect for our beloved deceased, the Mount Carmel Cemetery Board requires all individuals to follow these rules for decorating in our Catholic Cemetery.

- A bed of live annual flowers only is allowed in front of grave markers. It is not to exceed 14 inches deep and the width of the monument foundation. Plantings outside of these dimensions are subject to removal and/or mowing. Watering of flowers is not the responsibility of the cemetery.
- Shepherd Hooks for Hanging Baskets, Flags and Flag holders for Veterans are the only items allowed to be placed in the ground where grass is cut. They must be placed in line with the monuments. Flags for Veterans are the only flags permitted.
- Urns are allowed in line with monuments and may contain live or artificial arrangements or decorations that are Christian in nature. Artificial arrangements placed in the ground will be removed.
- Memorial Wreaths on stands are only permitted beginning November 15<sup>th</sup> and must be removed by April 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Statues must be of a religious type acceptable to the Catholic faith, are to be placed on the foundation of the monument or on a separate foundation in line with the monument. Statues not of a religious nature and other objects (toys, trinkets, coins, balloons, golf balls, playing cards, wire decorations, glass vases, porcelain figurines, stones, woodchips, etc.) will be removed.
- Solar lights are permitted but must be placed in an urn, hanging basket, attached to a shepherd hook, or in the allowed flower bed. If placed in an area where grass is cut or trimmed, they are subject to removal. If in a flower bed, they must be removed for fall and spring cleanup.
- Planting of trees, bushes, or perennials is not allowed.
- Decorating of trees is not allowed.
- Dog walking, roller blading, skate boarding, or horseback riding is not allowed.
- Refuse (such as plastic, cardboard, metal, glass, etc.) is to be removed from the cemetery. Whatever items you bring to the cemetery you must remove when you are finished decorating. Do not throw trash in the woods, place on a grave site or leave along the road. No hoses, water cans or containers may be left in the cemetery.
- Trees, shrubs, and bushes that are in the cemetery are property of the cemetery, and may be removed or trimmed at the discretion of the cemetery board or maintenance staff.

- Are homebound and would like a priest to visit;
- Are ill or are in a hospital and would like a priest to visit;
- Changed your phone number;
- You've moved or are moving from the area (you should register at a parish in the town you'll reside);
- Left the parish or have joined a different church.

We aren't able to change the information unless it is reported by an immediate family member. Some instances cost the parish money, such as mailing you envelopes you won't use and you remain on our CSA list, if we are not informed.
